

We will now begin the fourth lecture on the Study of Evangelism. /We will study Mark 16:15.

/Read verse 15. /He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation.

/Jesus said, "Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation."

/Chapter 5. Types of Evangelism. /Jesus said, "Preach the good news to all creation." /This means that we are to preach the gospel to all nations and peoples. /We are not to preach the gospel to one specific person.

/There are many countries today /and many peoples. /All peoples need the gospel. /Then let's take a look at the types of evangelism. /1. Door-to-Door Evangelism.

/"Door-to-door evangelism" is the act of going from house to house to share the gospel. /There are many different types of families in this world. /Hence, we must preach the gospel to each home. /It is important to first have a grasp of what a family is like before visiting them.

/Does this family believe in Jesus? /Did they stop believing in Jesus? /Did they move here from somewhere else? /Do they worship other gods because they don't know God? /It is important that we have a grasp of what families are like before we evangelize from door-to-door.

/We must understand what families are like when we evangelize. /For example, we can encourage churchgoers to continue to go to church. /If there is anyone who stopped going to church, we must pray for them and save their family.

/If there is someone new in the neighborhood who moved from a far place, we must preach the gospel to them and lead them to church. /If there is a family that does not believe in Jesus, we must pray and share the gospel with them. /We must first take notes about them as we evangelize.

/It is also important to remain close with unbelievers. /We must serve them and make sacrifices so that we could lead their families to church. /We must preach the gospel from house to house. /2. Street Preaching Evangelism. This is the act of preaching the gospel to people we meet in the street.

/We meet people in the street and give them tracts, pamphlets about the gospel. /We meet people and say, "Believe in Jesus and receive salvation." /Many people walk around on streets.

/Some people sell on the streets. /Merchants call out in the streets to sell goods. /When we meet people in the streets, we must not avoid them but preach the gospel.

/There is no need to think, “Does that person believe in Jesus?” /We must leave the answer to that question up to God, because when we share the gospel, the Holy Spirit will work in that person’s heart.

/3. Invitational Evangelism. /This is the act of inviting unbelievers over to our homes, /and having close relationships with them and leading them to God. /This is the act of inviting our neighbors to our homes for special occasions.

/When we share food with our neighbors and have close relationships with them, we can evangelize to them. /We can also invite others to small groups. /We must have good and close relationships with unbelievers.

/Then we can invite them to church or family events and share the gospel with them. /4. Evangelism Through Building of Schools. This is the act of evangelizing through the building of schools. /There is a growing number of Christian schools.

/There are schools ranging from elementary to universities /that are built to preach the gospel. /It is amazing to be able to share the gospel through the building of schools.

/It becomes an opportunity to share the gospel with students. /Christian schools /usually have regular curriculums, /and also have times where students can learn the Bible.

/There are times of worship, /times of learning the Bible, /and times of prayer /in Christian schools. /God permitted this method so that the gospel could be preached to students.

/There are many people who did not believe in Jesus in the past /who believe in Jesus after they enter Christian schools. /There are many students in Christian schools who did not want to believe in Jesus /but who learned the Bible and believed in Jesus.

/5. Hospital Evangelism. /When we evangelize in hospitals, many patients accept the gospel. /Those who have become physically weak /and sick in heart are weak in heart. /Patients want help from others.

/When we share the gospel with them when their spirits are weak, they receive it well. /It becomes a good opportunity for us to share the gospel with them.

/There are many people who accept Jesus /only after they suffer from their illnesses. /Hence, there is a need for us to evangelize in hospitals.

/6. Special Evangelism. /We evangelize in senior citizens’ centers. /We can also evangelize to groups of adolescents.

/We can also evangelize in orphanages. /We must say, “Even though your biological parents may have abandoned you, /you have a spiritual Father who lives forever.”

/We can also preach the gospel to soldiers. /Soldiers are young men who have hopeful future ahead of them. /It is important to preach the gospel to soldiers.

/At my church, we preach the gospel to soldiers every Saturday and Sunday. /We must preach the gospel to young men who do not know God. /We must not evangelize just to specific people, but to all types of people.

/Our subjects of evangelism must transcend all nations and peoples, and we must preach the gospel to everyone. /The Lord commanded us to go into all the world and preach the gospel.

/This gospel was not meant just for the Jews. /We must not only preach to the Jews, /but preach to the Gentiles /and all peoples around the world. /We must share the gospel with those closest to us.

/The people closest to us are our families. /Families must become one through faith in Jesus. /There is a woman named Lydia /in Acts 16:14. /God opened her heart /and made her listen to the words Paul spoke.

/Lydia was changed, /and hence, her whole family believed in Jesus and was baptized. /A church was established in Lydia's home. /She became a steppingstone for the gospel to be preached in Europe.

/One person's change can change many others. /Lydia changed and through her, her family was changed, /and God used her for the preaching of the gospel in Europe.

/We must preach the gospel to our relatives. /The disciples share the gospel /with their brothers. /Our relatives and closest acquaintances are subjects of the gospel. /We must also share the gospel with our friends.

/We must share the gospel with all our friends. /"If I don't evangelize to my friend, /he will not be saved and will go to hell!" /If we truly love our friends, /our friends, /and our relatives, /we must share the gospel and lead them to heaven.

/We must also share the gospel with little children. /Children are our nations' futures. /How great is it to preach the gospel to little children? /We must put the gospel and faith in their hearts /before the devil reaches into their hearts.

/We must thoroughly educate our children with faith in our homes. /The Jews thoroughly educate their children, /and hence, the Jews have great influence all around the world.

/Worldly education is indeed important, /but children must receive the gospel early so they can grow in faith. /Take a look at Moses' mother, Jochebed. /Jochebed educated her children with faith from the time Moses was breastfed.

/"Moses, you will save your people, the Israelites." /"Moses, you will be a leader of the

Israelites.” /Because Moses was educated in this way from a young age, 40 years of education in Egypt did not change him.

/We must plant concrete faith in children, faith in God’s existence. /Timothy learned the Bible from a young age. /Hence, he was able to become a great leader at such a young age. /Timothy was also blessed to have met a mother with good faith.

/It was also a blessing for Timothy to have met the apostle Paul, a great teacher of God’s word. /We must plant the gospel in children so that they can serve God, /before worldly ideologies begin to enter them.

/Worldly education is important, /but it is more important for us to evangelize to students so that they believe in Jesus. /Students who believe in Jesus at an earlier age can grow spiritually and mentally healthier /than students who believe later as adults.

/Then they can grow to become good workers at church. /Abraham Lincoln was President of the United States. /He received the gospel at a young age through his mother. /Lincoln’s mother died early.

/Do you know what gift his mother gave him? /She gave her son a Bible. /Then Lincoln’s mother said to her son, /“God’s word will guide you.” /“If you read the Bible in times of difficulty, God will bless you.”

/It is extremely important to share the gospel with young children. /A nation’s future depends on evangelism to young children. /Even though children may not know well at first, they will when the Holy Spirit works in them.

/It is also very important to preach the gospel to adolescents, or teenagers. /Teenagers must grow in faith so that they do not stray when they grow up. /How many teenagers are there who roam about in the world? /There are students who deviate from the right track. /There are teens who disobey their parents. /There are teens who commit crimes and do evil.

/It is important that we establish more churches instead of police stations so that we can share the gospel with them. /The crime rate for teens is increasing. /We must preach the gospel to them so that they do not commit crimes but grow healthily.

/It is important for us to share the gospel with children /and teens. /It is easy for someone to receive the gospel at a young age. /Children’s hearts are more innocent.

/Children are not yet stained with the world in their hearts. /Thus, it is extremely important to evangelize to children and teenagers.

/We must also go and evangelize to people who move to our neighborhoods. /If someone moves to our neighborhoods, we must go befriend them, /become close, /and help them. /Then we must evangelize to our neighbors through such relationships.

/Why did God bring this person to my neighborhood? /God brought this person so that we could evangelize and lead them to Jesus. /We must take a good look at our neighborhoods.

/Did someone move into my neighborhood? /We must diligently evangelize and lead them to God. /We must also share the gospel with everyone we meet in this world. /If we meet someone in the elevator, we must share the gospel with them. /If we meet people in the market, we must share the gospel with them.

/When we meet people at work, we must share the gospel with them. /We must always /be determined to share the gospel with everyone we meet. /Why did God make me meet this person? /It will not be coincidental.

/God allows us to meet people so that we can evangelize to them. /It is important that we meet subjects of evangelism.

/We met our parents the moment we were born, /and it was a blessing for us to have been born into families of faith. /We also have friends in this world. /When we share the gospel with our friends, we can save them.

/God also told us to go to the ends of the earth and preach the gospel. /Who else must we evangelize to? /We must preach the gospel to those who are suffering.

/We must evangelize to those who suffer from sicknesses, /those who have failed in businesses, /those who wander in this world, /those who are poor and neglected, /and those who face crises in their lives. /There are many problems in this world.

/It is a good opportunity for us to share the gospel with those who are suffering. /God allows some people to believe in Jesus through their sufferings.

/Some believe in Jesus after they fail in their businesses. /Some believe in Jesus, not when they're healthy, but when they become sick. /It becomes a good opportunity for people to accept the gospel /when they face crises in life.

/People become fragile in heart when they face difficulties. /They want something to rely on. /They also desire help from something.

/In Acts 3, /there was a man who was crippled from birth. /He was a beggar and a poor person. /He sat in front of the temple gates daily and begged. /He spent his entire life begging before others.

/When Peter and John went to the temple to pray, /they preached about Jesus to the crippled man.

/The crippled man then believed in Jesus and stood up. /He ran into the temple. /He

praised God.

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/In the same way, we must share the gospel with the sick. /God established the church so that we would preach the gospel to everyone.

/We must also share the gospel with the rich. /In Luke 19:1 /is a man named Zacchaeus. /He was a well-known man, a tax collector, /and a wealthy man. /However, although he had money and authority, his heart was not content.

/Then one day, Jesus preached the gospel to the rich Zacchaeus /as He passed through Jericho. /Zacchaeus accepted Jesus.

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/The Lord said, /“Today, salvation has come to this house.” /Then the Lord said, /“For the Son of Man came /to seek and to save what was lost.”

/We must preach the gospel to all people, /the rich and the poor. /When we preach the gospel, God will make his chosen people return to him.

/We must evangelize in our homes and workplaces. /We must also evangelize to people we do business with. /We must preach the gospel wherever we are, to whoever we meet. /We must evangelize with our lips, with our actions, and through documents.

/Chapter 6. Need for Evangelism. /Why do we need evangelism? /What are things we must prepare in order to evangelize well? /These are questions we must answer to know the need for evangelism.

/All believers must receive training to evangelize. /All believers must be trained to be evangelists. /There are more believers in the church than pastors and other leaders. /Believers will meet numerous unbelievers.

/They will naturally meet unbelievers at work and at the marketplaces. /They will have the most opportunities to evangelize. /Therefore, we must train them and send them out into the world.

/When believers of the early church gathered, they prayed /and went out to evangelize. /Believers must evangelize in marketplaces, /at work, /and to their colleagues.

/It is easier for believers to meet unbelievers than pastors. /Therefore, we must train believers so that the world can change. /The gospel can conquer the world when trained believers are sent out.

/Each church must train evangelists. /How must we train believers? /There must be

theoretical and practical training.

/We must not simply have knowledge of evangelism. /We need practical training. /When we tell believers to go and evangelize, they will first say that they cannot. /They think it is difficult to evangelize to others.

/Sometimes, believers are afraid to evangelize. /We must experience this firsthand so that we can grow as evangelists. /We will meet many different people when we go out.

/We can receive training through our meetings with different people. /We will gain wisdom to evangelize when we meet different people.

/It will be difficult to speak when we begin to evangelize. /It is scary when we meet new people. /However, we will grow courageous in heart through practical training. /Thus, we must receive both theoretical and practical training.

/We must practically introduce the things we learned theoretically. /“We humans are all sinners.” /“Man is subject to death because of his sins.” /“Man will not live forever on this earth.”

/“There is surely heaven and hell.” /“However, if you believe in Jesus, /you will receive forgiveness of your sins and you can go to heaven.” /“Jesus alone is our Savior.” /“Jesus took up your sins and died on the cross.”

/“Jesus resurrected to life in three days.” /“You can go to heaven if you believe and receive forgiveness of your sins.”

/We must testify to the cross and resurrection of Jesus. /It is important that we preach the gospel through such training.

/Jesus too trained His disciples. /Jesus trained His disciples for three years. /Jesus personally showed an example. /Jesus traveled to various locations and preached the gospel.

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/There must be many disciples of the Lord in the church. /We must train many disciples and send them out into the world. /Those who want to become pastors must be sent to seminaries so that they too can preach the gospel. /Pastors must be trained in seminaries and sent into other countries as missionaries.

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/Thus, the church must train evangelists. /We must bring up disciples and sent them out. /The church does the most important work in preaching the gospel of God. /The church must be faithful in this.

/The church must train evangelists just as Jesus trained the disciples. /Then the trained must go out and train others. /Those who at first lacked confidence /will gain confidence once they receive training. /Those who are trained must also train others and send them out.

/All believers in the church must become evangelists. /Hence, there is a great need for training evangelists.

/Pastors must evangelize, /leaders must evangelize, /and believers must evangelize as well. /God's kingdom will surely advance when many are trained to be evangelists.

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/Let us receive power from God and preach the gospel in these Last Days. /This is how we can live, and how we can save others. /I pray that you will become trained evangelists who go out and preach the gospel.
